Greetings, members of TC39. At our first meeting we agreed that a new name is needed to replace the workingname of "ECMAScript". I agreed to take name suggestions and do initial research into suitability. I have

done this, and provided the results below.

The research I did was very informal and should not be treated as legal advice. I merely searched in public places for information using public tools such as AltaVista. We will need to do a more rigorous search to truly determine legal suitability. It is useful to do this informal pass to weed out names that obviously cannot be used since trademark searches take some time and are expensive to do.

I have divided the results into "viable" and "unviable". For each "unviable" name, I have described where the name is in current usage. When possible, I've provided a URL. I must stress strongly that some names that I have listed as viable probably have legal issues. In some cases, the terms appear so commonly in text that it is not possible to sort through all of the references to find whether they are at all relevant. For example, one of the suggestions is "DeScript" and this string shows up in hundreds of thousands of usages of the word "Description" and in a number of other places as well.
